



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

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
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The Junk Drawer, But it might come in handy one day...

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
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


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Ramen Noodles Are Your Friend, The main food group of the impecunious

Most folk think of ramen noodles as a slightly salty something to eat when there is nothing else available.

They are useful for this, yes, but they are very easily disguised and turned into quite tasty dishes.

PeaPod will start you all off easy, for some of the ramen things she makes require actual cooking, and ingredient purchasing.

For starters, she will teach you to make very inexpensive chicken noodle soup.

You need a kettle that holds at least 1 quart for this, 1 1/2 quarts is better

Put the pan onto the stove and turn on a medium heat

add:

A gob of butter or margarine
roughly the size of a big gumball

One stalk of celery

A half of a carrot

Do the same as for the celery.

One package ramen noodles, any flavor

Without opening the package, break up the ramen noodles and put them into the pan. Add the seasoning packet and the proper amount of water.

The proper amount of water is whatever the package says.

Some left over chicken

Leftover chicken comes from all kinds of places.

there may be a drumstick languishing in the fridger from KFC. No one wants to eat leftover cold KFC, the crispy coating is soggy, rather than crispy, and nuking it doesn't help. Peel off the breading and cut the meat into bits, and add to the soup.

The bits that you can get off the bones of one of the grocery store rotisserie chickens also works well, as does the left over chicken breast mom sent home from yesterday's barbeque.

Put the chicken in with everything else, and cook until the noodles are soft.

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

Ah, a cooking thread. Be still my beating heart.

Hamburger, Rice and Peas is a dish that was introduced to me by my husband's mother. It is able to fill three of the four major food groups on one plate in times of "Oh my God, what the \$#% @ am I going to make for dinner?" Add a glass of milk and you're golden.

This is a lighter dish than the traditional "Helper" in a box. It is not laden with heavy sauces, but is quite tasty. Due to annoyance, I will abbreviate Hamburger, Rice and Peas as HRP from here on out.

HRP

One pound (ish) of kinda lean ground beef. I would say 85% beef is my favorite. That little bit of leftover juice from the beef becomes the "sauce".

A box of frozen peas. 10 oz, I think.

Two HEAPING cups of Minute Rice NOT cooked according to package directions. More on that later.

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


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Potatoes, More than just "Buds"

Your mother loves you, and like PeaPod, she also does not want you to starve. Mom can't use 10 pounds of potatoes, because, after all, it is just her and Dad since you moved out, so she is bringing you your very own 5 pound bag of potatoes.

Lucky you!!!

PeaPod is sure that your first inclination is to sit them on the kitchen counter and leave them there until the sprouts take over the kitchen, and you need a machete to reach the Cheerios, or, and this is perhaps worse, they sit there and become squishy, fuzzy and sentient.

Fear not, PeaPod is here to save you from either horror.

Of course, anyone can take a spud, toss it in the nuke and hit the baked potato button with no help from from Betty Crocker, let alone PeaPod.

But why resort to that when there are such simple things that anyone can do to elevate the cute lil tubers to the rank of a Side Dish?

Try this one:

1 spud, the size of a girls fist per person

Taters are individualistic critters, and that is a rough approximation of a serving. If you have lil spuds, use more for a serving. If they are really, really big, think of a half for a serving. Also, if you are super duper hungry, make more.

1 bottle of Italian salad dressing

Cut up the spud(s) into chunks that are roughly the size of half a golf ball.

Put them into an oven safe pan, baking dish or casserole.

Pour some Italian salad dressing on them. Use a little for one spud, more for lots of spuds. Stir them around a little so that they are all covered with the dressing.

Now, here is the only tricky part.

Turn the oven on...picking a temperature between 300 and 425 degrees. *stay with her here* They take longer to cook at 300, and they get done faster at 425. Either way, they will get done.

PeaPod gives a range so that if you wish to cook something that *has* to be at a certain temperature, you can cook your spuds at the same time.

Pop them in the oven, and give them a stir every 15 minutes or so.

They are done when they are soft when you stab them with a fork and are a lil bit brown.

How long does that take?

Let PeaPod explain something.

Cooking is an inexact art. Ovens may say that they are set at 350, but really be at 375 inside. Taters can be really dense and need more time, or old and floury and cook right away. Therefore, PeaPod won't tell you how long to bake your taters. On average, they take about an hour at 350.

PeaPod can hear many of you out there groaning, and muttering dark things about leftovers, but the key here is variety.

No one wants to eat the same thing over and over again for weeks. (Unless you are like PeaPod, and there is turkey involved, but that is a story for another time.) So, what PeaPod wants to do is show you how to make lots of one thing and turn it into all kinds of new and exciting

incarnations. Or at least two incarnations, because it is late, and she has to make potroast in the morning.

(Those of you reciting the list of things that the mother from the film "A Christmas Story" could do with turkey can just stop it right now.) 

Let us forget turkeys until November, and return to that thrilling post of yesteryear, in which your mother gave you a bag of potatoes. You already knew about nuking them, and PeaPod gave you a most delicious recipe for seasoned roasted taters. She thinks it is highly likely that you managed to make short work with those, if only because of the novelty of it all.

What you might not suspect, is that your mom will be so impressed, that she will bring you yet another bag of potatoes, so it is time to do more things with them before she brings you yet more potatoes.

The next time you nuke a potato, nuke lots. Say eight average sized ones.

Eat one for dinner, or whatever, and put the rest in the fridge, well wrapped in plastic wrap. Or foil, if you like that, or a zippie plastic bag. Tupperware is, of course, an option, but if you think your Mom is overwhelming you with tubers, PeaPod will leave it to your imagination what will happen if you let her know you need Tupperware...

Anyway, back to topic.

Those cold taters can feed you in lots of ways.

You can take a few, and peel them, cut them into chunks, add mayonaise (PeaPod prefers the tangy zip of Miracle Whip) a hard boiled egg chopped and a dollop of mustard to them; mix well and have potato salad.

or...

You could leave the skins on, chunk them up and fry them in a little butter until they are brown, and have homefries. The adventurous might consider adding some chopped onion or green pepper to them as they fry.

Perhaps in the next post, PeaPod will have you get fancy. 

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
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Seafood Pasta Primavera, easier than Kraft dinner

This is a nice recipe because it is very imprecise. It requires no fancy equipment, and looks pretty too.

1 box, bag or envelope of some sort of creamy noodle side dish.

Think Pasta-Roni--store or no-name brands work just as well, and are way cheap.

1 Carrot

a fresh carrot cut into thin slices works, a handful of frozen carrots works, a can of canned carrots works too. If you use the canned kind, get rid of the liquid in the can.

1 Something Green

A handful* of broccoli, fresh chopped or frozen works well. A few leaves of fresh chopped spinach is nice too--and PeaPod promises you won't taste it. it is just there for color. A handful* of frozen peas is nice too. (of course 😊)

Some sort of seafood

Shrimpies, frozen or a few from the store are PeaPods favorite. For

bachelors on a budget, only buy six or seven of them, and cut them in half the long way. They will cook up into the cutest little spirals, and go farther. You can do the same thing with scallops. Canned oysters can be dumped in, just get rid of the liquid or it will taste too fishy. Canned clams or shrimpies work too--no liquid from their cans either.

Do exactly what the package of noodles says to do, but add everything else to the pan.

That's it.

Really.

To really look fancy, bake up some of the cute biscuits that come in the cans in the dairy case, break open a fresh bag of salad mix, and a bottle of wine.

mmmmmmm

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


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The Teakettle Incident, How the International Survey was born
